The Birches Rebuild Project

In 2021 the Government of Nova Scotia announced that our facility would be replaced. Since that time, our team has been hard at work laying the groundwork for that project!



We are thrilled that the project to build this new facility is moving forward at an impressive pace. Our seniors in long term care are a priority, and deserve the safest space to live that we can provide.

Step 4 of the process has been completed and submitted to the Department of Seniors and Long Term Care (DSLTC) in December 2022. We are currently awaiting their review and comments.

This included:

- Production of the layout (concept) design of the new facility with large scale drawings printed. This has been very exciting for the team and we are very happy to be able to share this with everyone!
- Updating of project budget, including the costing of equipment, furniture and fixture that will be required in the new building.

We have narrowed the site selection down to our top two sites and are in the process of negotiating the purchase of land from our #1 choice.

This process will include an appraisal of the land, which is already underway.

While waiting for comments back from DSLTC on Step 4, we are preparing to work on Step 5 (Schematic Design).

As part of this step we are preparing tender documents to have the following services conducted as part of our due diligence for the purchase of the land:

- · Geotechnical Investigation
- Topographical Survey
- Hydrological Study

"We are constantly moving towards enhancing our care and giving our residents the best experience possible at The Birches."


Report to Our Community 2022-23
